Minutes of the meeting of Uplyme Parish Council held at the Uplyme Village Hall on Wednesday 13th February 2019 at 7.15pm.

Public Bodies (admissions to meetings) Act 1960 s1 extended by the LG Act 972 s 100.

Resident asked if the up and coming defibrillator training has been advertised on Wednesday 13/03/2019, Clerk replied that posters and information have been put everywhere as possible to advertise the event.

Resident and riparian land owner explained to the Council that the culvert off Cuckoo Lane was inadequate and only agreed with Devon County Council Highways to be fitted if the Parish Council agreed to maintain it back in 2015. (There was evidence recently found (minutes and correspondence) to support this back in 2015).

Although this was cleared out by the riparian land owner and a friend recently, there were no offers of help from the residents in Cuckoo Lane who complained about the flooding. The Council had mixed opinions about the maintenance of the culvert and decided to fully debate this on the agenda item in standing orders.

Report from County Councillor - Mr Ian Lloyd Hall

Met with Local Parish Councillors at Musbury Village Hall on 25/01/2019 to discuss current issues pending with Devon County Council Highways.

Cllr Hall is strongly in agreement to promote and support the Social Care, GPS, Devon Health and Wellbeing Board which has reviewed its priorities and approach and hopefully provide a working group from Sidmouth through to the Axe Valley because of the current demand on services, high costs and demographic pressures coupled with the impact of preventable premature morbidity and mortality and reduced funding will continue to put pressure on the local health and care system. I want to focus on the individual, supported by families and friends within their local communities. All resources and assets in places must be used to support the wider determinants of health and improve health and wellbeing outcomes. There needs to be a shift towards prevention and early intervention which will require services to organise and professionals to behave in very different ways.

Axminster has a walk in surgery and I believe we need to do an assessment and strategic plan for local needs. Cllr James pointed out that there are specific issues around the border of East Devon and Dorset especially in Uplyme where residents cross the border to use Dorset medical facilities and where the different counties hold separate records of an individual.

Cllr Kidson also explained that because of the DT (Dorset) postcode in Uplyme, it is difficult to access the Devon system, on some occasions residents have been turned away from the Axminster surgery and confusion to what emergency hospital should be used in emergencies.

Cllr Hall supports the decision by East Devon District Council's strategic planning committee to support the master plan, which sets out how the town in Axminster should be developed to include thinking strategically and becoming more resilient in the impact of ever changing globalisation and technology. We aim to ensure a viable sixth form at Axminster Academy, with education running from pre-school age right through to preparing for work, college or university. The town centre must be free of heavy vehicles and congestion, attracting people in and inviting investment from retail and food outlets trading during the day and into the evening.

Report from District Councillor - Mr Ian Thomas

Cllr Thomas welcomed the new Council head office at Blackdown House, Honiton and formally invited Uplyme Councillors to visit.

Seaton Wetlands has been nominated the best Nature Reserve of the Year category in the BBC Countryfile Magazine 2019 award. It was up against some stiff competition in Findhorn Bay, Moray; The Falls of Clyde, Lanarkshire; RSPB Ham Wall, Somerset and Carlton Marshes, Suffolk.

The Axminster By Pass relief road master plan has been prepared by consultants working on behalf of the council in partnership with the landowners/developers – The Crown Estate and Persimmon Homes. The master plan has been prepared following consultation events last July and December (2018) and provides a template for development of the

area to include a mixture of housing, employment and community uses as well as a range of public open spaces and the proposed north/south relief road. The master plan aims to determine a distribution of uses across the site, the route of the relief road and to provide design guidance for developers to follow when submitting planning applications on the site. This includes different character areas within the site to ensure that the development forms an attractive neighbourhood for residents.

19/37 | Cuckoo Lane Culvert on Riparian Land

Resolved: after a long debate in public speaking around this agenda item, the Council noted the latest situation, correspondence, discussed and approved a resolution that Uplyme Parish Council is to maintain the Culvert located on riparian land off Cuckoo Lane until as agreed the 25th January 2020, after which the responsibility will be handed back to the riparian owner.

Councillor James, Pratt, Duffin and the Clerk volunteered to clear the culvert imminently.

19/38 | Millennium Copse

Resolved: A special thanks from the Council was made to Local Resident and volunteer Terry Sweeney for providing a seat for the use of the public at the Millennium Copse.

Councillor R Turner was absent at the meeting but informed the Clerk that the contractor (Fluxy's) had just sent the quote for the annual maintenance of the Millennium Copse for review and the MC team will report to the Council at the next meeting. Councillor Duffin reported that he had recently planted another forty trees on the MC site and also that he was misquoted on the costs for spraying the brambles.

19/39 | Uplyme Traffic Management Strategy and Highways

Resolved: Councillor Ostler and A Turner reported back from their meeting with DCC Highways on 25/01/2019. After a long discussion, several issues were discussed and resolutions sought, with the main areas being the dangerous overhanging trees and branches on the B3165 from Uplyme to Hunters Lodge, ploughing of the affected roads around Uplyme, the status of the grit bins, DCC Highways responsibility of the crack in the wall and the road subsiding on the B3165 near Crogg Lane, the parking of a residents car in Church Street that would obstruct emergency vehicles passing (Councillor James believes he knows the owner of the vehicle and will contact him) and the parking of the owners car on the threshold of Lyme Road at the Cooks Mead roundabout that obscures visibility and caused road traffic accidents and near misses. Councillor Ostler and A Turner asked the question to DCC highways of who owns this strip of land, access and any covenants attached.

19/40 Affordable Housing 'Exception Sites' – Community Land Trusts (CLT)

Resolved: Councillor James reported that Guinness and Yarlington housing associations replied and were not interested in partnership working because the sites are too small, Hastoe have not replied. There is a final meeting with Wessex CLT on the 18/02/2019, which after this, the Council will have the opportunity to decide with the current information to proceed with a CLT or not use the exemption sites in Uplyme for affordable housing which were designated within the Neighbourhood Plan.

19/41 Uplyme Adverse Weather - Snow/Ice

Resolved: as the Chairman's announcement, the work accomplished by Councillor A Turner and resident volunteer John Fowler to make Uplyme a safer place and accessible was well received by the Council and parishioners. Councillor A Turner pointed out that it was a team effort and the robust gritter and organisation of the salt worked well. The Council approved running costs for machinery if requested by any parishioner which will be authorised by the Chairman.

19/42 Devon Air Ambulance (DAA) Night Landing Project

Resolved: Councillor Pullinger reported that the land owner (King George's Field) have given permission for the use of the night landing site. The request for funding has been submitted to EDDC Communities Together Fund with support from MAT electrics who are the main contractor and the DAA for this project, also the planning permission has been granted by EDDC planning to go ahead. There has been an incredible community response in donations coming from various people and groups to go towards this essential emergency project. Councillor Pullinger suggested that he will invite Toby Russell to talk on behalf of the DAA to Lyme Regis Town Council.

19/43 Overhanging Trees and Hedges

Resolved: The Council have distributed letters and advertised locally to known residents whose trees and vegetation overhang the B3165 Lyme Road. The Council would like to thank the many residents have responded and those who have taken advantage as a group to use local workman James Bennett to cut and trim the branches and hedges back at a reasonable cost. Unfortunately, there are still some dangerous trunks, trees and hedges still impeding the buses on this route which need resolving and have been again escalated to DCC Highways.

19/44 Uplyme Playground Maintenance and Future Costs

Resolved: Councillor Frost reported that the latest repairs to the swing fence, hedge and net fencing have been completed but the roundabout still needs fixing. The Clerk is to research costs and possible funding opportunities to either replace the whole playground or repair single equipment when it goes into disrepair. The Council have already been advised that there is S106 and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) available towards 'Outdoor Play'. Councillor Ostler is to speak to Sulina Tallack, Planning Obligation Officer East Devon District Council, 01395 516551, Extn 1549 to find out our options.
