Public Bodies (admissions to meetings) Act 1960 s1 extended by the LG Act 972 s 100.

Local volunteer and resident explained that the Ash Trees adjacent to 11 Yawl Crescent, alongside the B3165 (Lyme Road) are dangerously overhanging and damaging vehicles, the latest being a Travis Perkins lorry which delivers further down the road frequently. Councillor Andy Turner offered to contact David Lomas (EDDC Trees) for a site visit and try to resolve the issue.

Report from County Councillor – Mr Ian Lloyd Hall

Congratulations to all Parish Councillors of Uplyme on their re-election.

The retaining walls near Crogg Lane on both sides of Lyme Road are being looked at with further risk assessments sought to find out the integrity of the wall. Devon County Council is still trying to establish legal ownership and aspect of the wall, on the Crogg Lane side.

Councillor Ostler – Owners adjacent to the Millennium Copse are willing to give up some land to extend the Highways public footpath in return for stone wall being rebuilt. Councillor Hall suggested that there will be finance available from his locality budget if needed.

Woodhouse Hill sink/pot hole – Complaints that signs were put up and fenced off but no work has commenced to date. Councillor Frost stated that although they have re-surfaced Lyme Road it seemed unreasonable that they stopped yards short of a major well known recurring pothole and did not repair it. Councillor Hall replied that unfortunately, that is the case for sections of the road planned as it is all over Devon with the problem of pot holes.

Councillor Hall is still keen to progress with the Axe Valley Health & Wellbeing Forum and would like to involve Uplyme Parish Council.

Uplyme Parish Council is still asking if Devon Highways can do something about the overhanging trees alongside Lyme Road up to Hunters Lodge. Councillor Hall replied that they are looking into the First Bus Risk Assessments and the issue is ongoing to identify the responsibility. Uplyme Parish Council reiterated that after their site trip on a double decker bus on the same route, something needs to done immediately to stop a major incident.

Following the election of committee members, at 8.55pm the Council noted that Mrs Barbara Kidson verbally resigned from the Council after failing to gain a place on the Planning Committee. She was assured by the Chairman that nevertheless she could still play a major role in any future plans to provide social and affordable housing but she was adamant that she was resigning with immediate effect. The Chairman thanked her for her hard work for both the Parish Council and on the Neighbourhood Plan committee. Mrs Kidson then left the meeting.

19/109 | River Lym Path Link – Uplyme

Resolved: the Council discussed and agreed that we carry on campaigning to re-instate the bridge off Springhead Road, opposite the bottom of Crogg Lane (Footpath 64). Although we are aware that DCC budgets are stretched, the Council agreed that they could not offer any funding towards the new amount quoted (approximately £30k) that was needed overall to fix and maintain the footpath bridge. The Clerk stated that he has not received any formal finance request from PROW, DCC or other bodies. There are concerns that if the bridge did collapse into the river and cause blockage and flooding, who would be held responsible for this and how would it affect the adjacent landowners. The Chair suggested that we may have to consult and involve the Rambler's Association and other outside bodies if needed but in the meantime the Council will continue to apply pressure on Devon County Council to resolve this issue.
