You are summoned to a Hybrid VIRTUAL meeting of Uplyme Parish Council Planning; this will be held online by video conferencing on **Wednesday, 25th November 2020 at 6.00pm** and in a covered open area at Brooklands, DT7 3UY. The meeting will consider the items set out below.

Council are asked to note that in the exercise of their functions they must take note of the following: Equal opportunities (race, gender, sexual orientation, marital status and any disability); Crime and Disorder, Health and Safety and Human Rights.

Normally, before the meeting there will be a public session to enable the people of Uplyme to ask questions of, and make comments, regarding the Parish Council. Questions not answered at this meeting will be answered in writing to the person asking the question, or may appear as an agenda item for the next meeting. Members of the public are asked to restrict their comments, and/or questions to three minutes.

Photographing, recording, broadcasting or transmitting the proceedings of a meeting by any means is permitted. A person may not orally report or comment about a meeting as it takes place if he/she is present at the meeting of a parish council or its committees but otherwise may:

- Film, photograph or make an audio recording of a meeting;
- use any other means for enabling persons not present to see or hear proceedings at a meeting of a parish council as it takes place or later.
- Report or comment on the proceedings in writing during or after a meeting or orally report or comment after the meeting.

However, anyone wishing to do so must speak to the clerk prior to the meeting as there is policy which must be followed.

6.2 **20/2460/TCA**, Woodhyde, The Glen, Uplyme, Lyme Regis, DT7 3TR, T/1 Sycamore. Remove very extended lower limb. When in full leaf it abrades the shed in the picture. About 3 mts in length no cut will exceed 10 cms. T/2, very overgrown and extended Rhododendron. With the full permission of the neighbour Mr Laurence Cole at 16 Glebelands we would like to cut the Rhodo back to the wall and reduce it to approx 5ft so it can be managed as a hedge and will allow more light onto my client's garden area, Mr Peter Earle

6.3 **20/2475/FUL**, Sunny View, Lyme Road, Uplyme, Lyme Regis, DT7 3XA, Conversion of existing garage, construction of new garage and car port, Mr and Mrs McCollum

6.4 **20/2381/TRE**, Lindens, Mill Lane, Uplyme, Lyme Regis, DT7 3TZ, Ash - large branches ripped off in high winds. Tree Surgeon has suggested this has happened as the tree is very tall and so high wind cause the branches to "whip" about. Two of these have already fallen close to our property.
