

**Resolved**: following recent events from our Devon County Councillor and Highways, Councillor James suggested that Uplyme Parish Council should be more proactive and act in anticipation of future problems, needs, or changes. It is clear that we are getting no support from DCC and/or Highways and recent inaccurate correspondence and reports, demonstrate the lack of action from their department. We need to be stronger in our representation as a Council and control the situation by making things happen or by preparing for possible future problems by escalating matters to a higher level and highlight the failings by their department robustly. If we are more proactive it means anticipating what might happen, planning ahead, preparing in advance and acting ahead instead of simply reacting to circumstances.

#### 20/155 Uplyme Maintenance Responsibilities (Flood Management) – Devon County Council

**Resolved**: Council discussed the email response from County Councillor Ian Hall in regards of responsibility and maintenance of Uplyme culverts and flood prevention in full detail with a strong opposition being heard from members. After a lengthy hefty debate, the majority of members would like a show of 'no confidence' in the professionalism, support and relationship in the Devon County Councillor and the Highways officer and would like to escalate this formally to a higher level to rectify this problem and if needed to involve the press

in highlighting this inadequate service. Some Councillors asked if this would achieve anything in the long run. It was decided that the Chairman should draft a letter of complaint regarding the Parish Council's dissatisfaction and after approval send it to the appropriate County Council officers.

# 20/156 Uplyme Traffic Management Strategy and Highways

**Resolved**: Council discussed the latest updates and progress from the Uplyme Traffic Team to include the latest response from Highways regarding outstanding works and future actions sort.

- 1. Doing What Matters (DCC Highways) and Customer Service Centre Roads & Transport Team Council is asked to discuss and respond to latest request/report and approve future actions for Uplyme: The Council reported that the latest area report from the Devon County Councillor saying that the 'Doing what Matters' review is complete was inaccurate as the Uplyme Parish Council have not agreed to any of the proposed policies. Uplyme Parish Council have replied for a full breakdown of costs and figures which are dubious.
- 2. Response and action towards outstanding repairs from DCC Highways:

  Regular incidents are being updated on the DCC online portal as requested. There are still current incidents not completed or investigated in the Parish of Uplyme.
- 3. Discuss and respond to resident's proposal for extending the public pathway from Millennium Copse to opposite Crogg Lane and approve a possible way forward:

  The Clerk responded to the residents adjacent to the Millennium Copse, opposite Crogg Lane on the 17/07/2020 with the acknowledgement on the length of extending the path, visibility, the full advantage of sight for vehicles and pedestrians on the slight bend and possible exchange of land at the MC for partial exchange of their land within reason. The Council are seeking specialist and legal advice to see if this may happen and in the mean time what their final thoughts would be and any other proposals that they may have. The original proposal below is still highly favourable by the majority of the Council as a minimum.
- 4. Discuss the latest progress on Broadband in Uplyme and discuss any further actions:

  The Council are still waiting for official answers for implementing faster broadband in Uplyme from connecting Devon and Somerset (CDS). Gigaclear are fulfilling some of their contracts in Uplyme and are expecting to start connecting the first customers to their network early in 2021. more information at <a href="https://www.gigaclear.com">www.gigaclear.com</a>

#### 20/157 Trinity Hill Nature Reserve – Forestry Commission

**Resolved**: Council heard an update report from Councillor Andy Turner in connection with future works and safety at the Forestry England Trinity Hill reserve in Uplyme Parish. Following contact with the Forestry Ranger, it was established that the site was improved but still unsecure, due to the lack of the promised lockable height barrier entrance. Councillor Andy Turner and the Clerk offered contacts to local engineering companies to supply the barrier entrance. Forestry England will follow this up to secure the site from unwanted vehicles and overnight caravan/mobile vehicles.

#### 20/158 Uplyme Parish Council New WCAG Website

# 20/159 **Devon Emergency Resilience Fund Extension – Uplyme Emergency Plan**

**Resolved:** the Council supported and approved a contribution £391.84 from the general reserves to purchase the following essential equipment for use in Emergency Flood situations.

# 20/160 **S106** and Community Infrastructure Levy Monies

**Resolved:** Council are still waiting frustratingly to hear when and how they can access S106 and CIL monies that is owed to the Parish from the East Devon District Council, Community Engagement and Funding and Planning Obligation departments. The criteria now stated to access this money, seems unachievable, even though the Council voted unanimously to grant £3,771.00 to a local sports club to encourage the youth and outdoor activities back in 12<sup>th</sup> February 2020, minute reference: 20/38. District Councillor Ian Thomas will follow up again to find a solution.

# 20/161 Uplyme Playground

**Resolved:** Council heard a request from Councillor Frost for approval of the repair/replacement of the wet pour surface edge at the slide in the playground, as it is currently a trip hazard. The wet pour repair will have to be cut back 200mm and the kits have the perfect ratio of rubber crumb and polyurethane resin. This is suitable to complete a wet pour repair for an area of up to 1m² at a depth of 40mm of wet pour with the cost at £90.00 including tax. There are alternatives like returning the area back to grass with the use of rubber interlinking mats or the complete refurbishment of wet pour which costs approximately £70 per square metre. The Council agreed to receive costs for a full replacement of the wet pour as the repair of partial areas are not guaranteed. Clerk to investigate and present costs for approval.
